- **Adoption Subsidy**
 Program intended to help foster children achieve permanency through adoption. The adoption subsidy program assists special needs children in different ways. It can provide a monthly payment to help with the extra expense of caring for a special needs child. It also pays for medical, dental, psychiatric/psychological services and therapies not covered by private insurance or other public resources such as AHCCCS, school district, etc.) It may also pay for certain nonrecurring adoption fees that are reasonable and necessary expenses such as adoption fees, attorney costs and home study fees. An adoption case manager can help you find out more about the program and completing an application.

Your adult child also may qualify for benefits on your earnings record if he or she has a disability that started before age 22.
